





# SOUTHEAST Region EXCEPTIONS

GENERAL FISHING SEASONS, DATES, POSSESSION LIMITS AND RULES APPLY TO ALL WATERS WITHIN THE SOUTHEAST REGION, EXCEPT AS LISTED BELOW. (See pages 6-8 for general fishing seasons and limits).

## FAMILY FISHING WATERS:

McTucker Ponds, Alexander Reservoir, Crowthers Reservoir, Twin Lakes Reservoir.

• **THERE IS NO WINTER STREAM SEASON IN SOUTHEAST REGION.**

• **Cutthroat trout:** In all rivers and streams, EXCEPT as noted below, the trout limit may include ONLY 2 cutthroat, barbless hooks recommended. The daily limit in the Snake River, Bear River, Cub River, Blackfoot River downstream from Government Dam, Portneuf River, and McCoy Creek is 2 cutthroat, none under 16".


