

**Idaho Fish and Game Commission**

**February 28, 2013**

**LEGISLATION**

Deputy Director Sharon Kiefer provided a brief legislative update (Appendix 46, Exhibit 27).

**Fish and Game Sponsored Bill**

Ms. Kiefer reported that Senate Bills 1001, 1003 and 1004 are all in the 3<sup>rd</sup> reading in the House Resources and Conservation Committee. Senate Bill 1002 is still in the holding status and we do not expect to see any action on this bill.

**Rules – Concurrent Resolutions**

Senate Concurrent Resolutions 106, 107, 108, 109 and 110 all had a hearing yesterday in the House Resources and Conservation Committee.

**Status of Previously Discussed Bills**

HB 143 has been added to the House Resources and Conservation Committee hearing calendar.

HB 145 has not had a hearing in committee yet. The legislative sponsor, Representative Christy Perry will speak at the March Commission public meeting. Both ISCAC and IOGA are on record as opposing this bill.

HB 146 the sponsor has removed from the calendar and we do not expect to see any further action on this bill.

SB 1061 has passed the Senate and will be heard in the House Resources and Conservation Committee.

SB 1062 as amended has passed the Senate and is on to the House Resources and Conservation Committee.

SB 1104 is the FY 13 supplemental and has passed the Senate and is in the 3<sup>rd</sup> reading in the House.

HB161 has not had a hearing at this time but the Department will track this bill.

HJM1 is in the 3<sup>rd</sup> reading in the House.

**New Bill Analysis**

Ms. Kiefer noted that there are no new bills that have any specific impact on the Department that have been brought forward for discussion.
